- I. Call to Order President Gutierrez
 - **a.** Call to order at 1902hrs.
 - **b.** Roll Call/Quorum 2nd VP DeGroot announced a quorum is attending per the sign in sheet. A copy of the Attendance Sign In Sheet is attached to and a part of these Minutes.
- II. Opening Reflection Chaplain Kevin Ake
 - **a.** Prayer/Reflection. Jewish High Holidays.
 - **b.** Pledge of Allegiance.
- **III.** Consent Agenda President Gutierrez.
 - **a.** Approval of Minutes of June 24, 2025 Membership Meeting. The Minutes were not read but were distributed to all members in advance of the meeting. It was pointed out the Chaplain's last name was misspelled should be Ake. This will be corrected. Treasurer Arciola brought up that the minutes reflect the correct title of the "Deputy Superintendent" but the By-laws do not. He made a couple of other comments about By-laws provisions that require amending. President Gutierrez said that these issues will be addressed by the new By-laws committee and by the EB at its next meeting. A motion to approve the Minutes, as corrected, was made by Art Ellingsen and seconded by Chappy Ferrer. The motion was passed by unanimous voice vote.

IV. Public Comment.

- **a.** Art Ellingsen announced that VVA Chapter 311 will be dedicating a memorial to remember Agent Orange victims at 11 am on October 11 at Lake Park near the Lake Park Pavilion in Des Plains. All vets are invited to attend.
- **b.** Dennis Chavez of AL Post 104 said that the CC Sheriff has an Outpatient and Inpatient Placement Support Service that will help with family crisis situations.
- **c.** Eric Armstrong said that Brookfield Zoo has a Discovery Center that on October 11 from Noon to 3:00pm will have a Veterans Resource Fair that includes free admission to the Zoo. Also on October 18 free shots for vets & families will be available at the Crestwood Armory on October 18th and 26th beginning at 9:00am.
- **d.** Jim Schultz of Am Vets Post 66 announced a Job Fair aimed at helping vets by the ESGR, a DOD program that assists National Guard and reserve employees and their interaction with civilian employees. Local employers will be there. Need volunteers to help interview potential employers.
- **e.** Chaplain Kevin Ake announced his candidacy for US Congressman from the 8th Illinois District in the upcoming Primary Election. He would appreciate support from Republican vets and the signing of his petition.

- **V.** Governance Report Treasurer Robert Arciola
 - **a.** He reported on a meeting he had with VACCC staff to discuss various matters and to pick up some recent donations. The Membership Corp. account balance of \$5,028.57 is the same as the last report but the donations will be added to that after the deposits are made. A Motion to Approve was deemed not necessary per President Gutierrez. Rather the report will be placed on file with the organization.
 - **b.** Ratification of certain Executive Board Actions. None Required
- **VI.** VACCC Office Reports Superintendent Elizabeth Soto thanked everyone for attending and read the Mission Statement of the VACCC. She and staff members reported the following for the second quarter.
 - **a.** Concerning VACCC staff she announced the hiring of Justyna Berry as Manager of Veteran Services. She has a strong background in veterans affairs and brings a wealth of knowledge to the VACCC. We now have a total dedicated staff of ten. Superintendent Soto invited Ms. Berry to say a few words. She gave a brief summary of her military service in the US Army and, later, with the VA. Was a VSO manager but his is the best job she has ever had. Regarding veterans and their families she said, "we will fight for you" with respect to claims and all benefits that they are entitled to receive. Ms. Berry invited all vets to visit her office and give her the opportunity to assist them. President Gutierrez the swore her in as an employee of the VACCC which was followed by enthusiastic applause from the attendees.
 - **b.** Financial & Disbursement Report. Regarding the new facilities, the Rolling Meadows Court House they are still working with CC Property Management team to finalize the office plans. Also, we are going into final stages of completing improvements the new space on the 14th floor of the 69 West Washington building and working on move-in plans. With respect to the 3rd Quarter Financial s, copies of which were made available, she referred us to pages of the report that reported on (1)Personnel Services, that include staff salaries and benefits, (2) Operations and Maintenance, (3) Direct Disbursements, which contain information on recently achieved milestones in disbursements to veterans. Quarter-over-Quarter results were also significant. Moving to the Budget, Superintendent Soto pointed to significant increases in all of the important budget categories, **c.** VSO Report. Deferred.
 - **d.** Connor Intress gave the Outreach Report. He began with a summary of the goals and purposes of the Outreach programs. He the summarized recent data about events, demographics, communities served, and needs. Quarter-over-Quarter increases were significant and dramatic. Going forward in the 4th Quarter, the plans are to increase the number and the focus of Outreach events to the South and East areas of the City which are the most under-served. Connor then introduced two representative of an organization called "Tomorrow Starts Today" whose mission is to increase computer literacy among senior veterans. They gave an extended presentation of its goals and plans to achieve them while working with the VACCC to benefit the veterans we serve. Superintendent Soto pointed out that VACCC member organization and their comrades will be given the opportunity to work with Tomorrow Starts Today to increase their computer skills at no charge.
 - **e.** There were no questions from the floor. A motion to approve the Office Report was made by 2nd VP DeGroot and duly seconded. The motion was passed by unanimous voice vote.

VII. Bylaws – No report as Chair is vacant. On the By-laws Committee going forward, Treasurer Arciola volunteered to be the Chairman. Evamarie Duff, Ran Tyner, Eric Morales, 2nd VP DeGroot and George Gandara also volunteered to serve on the Committee. All were appointed by President Gutierrez. The announced goal is to have draft amendment recommendations ready by the next membership meeting.

VIII. Budget – 1st VP Brown. No report.

IX. Services Provided – No report as Chair is vacant. President Gutierrez asked for volunteers to serve on the committee. George Gandara and Chevonne Woodward volunteered and were appointed by President Gutierrez.

X. Unfinished Business – President Gutierrez

- **a.** Report on the Membership Corporation. Tabled.
- **b.** Further discussion about Presidents Gutierrez' decision to have our Counsel attend all future meetings regarding costs. In response to a question from the floor about the cost, Josh said that between \$1,200 and \$1,500/meeting is a good estimate. There were no objections to this estimate by the membership.

XI. New Business -- President Gutierrez

- **a.** Election of At Large Board Member. 2nd VP DeGroot nominated Interim Member Randall Tyner, seconded by Secretary Parker. George Gandara nominated Evamarie Duff, seconded by Eric Morales.
- **b.** Evamarie said she is 4th District VFW Commander and has always supported veterans causes, especially female vets, and wants to help the VACCC in any way she can. Ran Tyner said he has been a VACCC delegate since 2020, is a retired Marine, and was employed by the Ill AG for past five years. The will be happy to serve on the VACCC Board.
- **c.** 2nd VP DeGroot conducted a roll call election. The result of the voting was Evamarie, 22 votes and Ran, 14 votes as announced by 2nd VP DeGroot. Evamarie was declared the winner. A copy of the Election Tally Sheet is attached to and is a part of these minutes.

XII. Good of the Order – President Gutierrez.

- **a.** Paul Bezazian, VFW Post 8322, announced a Stand Down on November 14 from 8:30am until 2:00pm at the Northwest Armory, 1553 N. Kedzie in Humbolt Park. All vets welcome.
- **b.** Treasurer Arciola mentioned an email he received from 2nd VP DeGroot regarding a set of Standard Operating Procedures for the VACCC membership. He thought his should be taken up by the By-Laws Committee. There was general agreement on that.
- **c.** 2nd VP DeGroot said the next EB meeting will be on September 30 at 1830hrs. at AL Post 36 in Des Plaines. DeGroot said we must have a quorum of elected Board members to transact any business and he made sure Evamarie was aware of this. He also mentioned the possibility of getting office space in the Jesse Brown Building. In October there will be a budget meeting of Cook County Commissioners down town. He said that we can show our interest and support of the VACCC by having a "room full of hats" there.
- **d.** Presentation of award to John Steciw by 2nd VP DeGroot. President Guttierrez read a plaque in recognition of John's leadership and guidance that has left a lasting legacy. Standing Ovation! John said the VACCC used to be a real mess. Thanks to our newer members (especially Dutch) we have made a tremendous comeback. Another Standing Ovation! Superintendent Soto made an emotional statement the importance John's contribution to the VACCC and that it would not be where it is today without him. Justyne eiterated her dedication to the VACCC and the veterans it serves.

- **e.** Todd Moore of DAV Chapter 33 asked several question of Superintendent Soto regarding some specifics contained in her report about the use of remaining budgeted funds in the last two months of the Quarter, the certification process for new VSO s, VSO caseloads, and our absence from the October 11 Resource Fair, all of which were answered satisfactorily by the Superintendent, Deputy Superintendent Grant Jacobs and Manager, Veteran Services, Derek Giffin. Moore is also Assistant Deputy Chief Administration for Cook County as well as a delegate for his DAV chapter. He also said more than once that because of his position with the County he felt that he can be a resource for the VACCC and the County to reduce the "historical friction" between the organizations. Superintendent Soto and President Gutierrez addressed the friction issue in a comprehensive manner.
- **f.** George Gandara talked about the importance of suicide prevention and his personal concerns with the issue. He said he had some handouts about this.
- **g.** A. L. Member Duff announced that on September 26 from 4:00pm to 6:00pm a Women's Forum will be held in Forrest Park.

XIII. Future Meeting Sites Update -- 2nd VP DeGroot The date will be December 16, 2025 at a time and location TBA.

XIV. Adjournment-- President Gutierrez

President Gutierrez closed with a thank you to the Board, Members and guests for their contributions to a very productive meeting. Upon a proper Motion by 2nd VP DeGroot, duly seconded, the meeting was adjourned at 2110 hrs. by unanimous voice vote.





Intake System Metric Breakdown


